
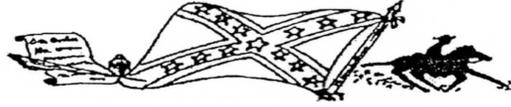

GUN SHOW



Our camp will have an information/recruitment table set up at the upcoming gun show at the Magnolia Center in Laurel on the weekend of Saturday 23rd & Sunday 24th. W. D. Cameron Camp in Meridian will have their's the last Sunday in April and this year that will be the 28th, beginning at 3 PM. The cemetery is located above Meridian at Lauderdale Springs with around 1100 buried there, with about 70 Union soldiers included.

On Monday, the 29th at noon, in downtown Meridian, there will be a joint service of both SCV camps and two UDC chapters in front of the courthouse.

Same day at 4:15 our camp will have a brief service on the grounds of the courthouse in Ellisville next to the Confederate monument.

At 5:15 our camp will have a second service in downtown Laurel on the grounds of the Laurel courthouse next to the Confederate monument.

There could be other memorial services held in various locations in which some of our color guard members may want to participate. Also sometimes there may be families that may ask for a ceremony

to be conducted for an ancestor(s). There are times when these last minute requests could enter into May and or June.

The Civil War/World War II Connection

Here are famous WW II personalities connected in one way or another to famous (and some not so famous) War for Southern Independence personalities. Some names you will recognize; others may surprise you. By no means is this list complete.

Confederate General Nathan Bedford Forrest, great (?) grandfather of...Brig. General Nathan Bedford Forrest III, USAAF - Shot down over the Baltic Sea while leading a bombing raid on the submarine yards at Kiel in June of 1943. His body was found when it washed up at a German Seaplane base in September of that year. He was buried by a detail of the German navy, but was disinterred in 1947 to be reburied in Arlington National Cemetery.

Major General Arthur MacArthur - 24th Wisconsin Infantry, Medal of Honor recipient for planting the flag on Missionary Ridge, fought in the Indian wars and the Spanish-American War. He was the father of...General Douglas MacArthur

General Adna R. Chaffee, Sr. - 1st Lt. In the 6th US Cavalry at the end of the War. He was breveted Captain at the end of the War because of his conduct at Dinwiddie Court House. He fought in the Indian Wars and the Spanish-American War, finally serving as Chief of Staff of the U.S. Army. He is the father of...Major General Adna R. Chaffee, Jr. - He and Patton are considered to be the fathers of the WWII - Armored Corps.

Confederate Lt. Col Waller Tazewell Patton - led the 7th Virginia during Pickett's charge at Gettysburg where he was mortally wounded, great - uncle of...Major General George S. Patton, Jr.

Col. George S. Patton killed at 3rd Winchester, grandfather of...Major General George S. Patton, Jr.

Confederate Col. Charles Marshall, Gen. Lee's aide-de-camp/adjutant, present with Lee at the McLean House at Appomattox, uncle of...WWII U.S. Chief of Staff, and creator of Marshall Plan, Major General George C. Marshall.

Confederate Major General Fitzhugh Lee, Cavalry

leader, nephew of Robert E. Lee, grandfather of...Captain Fitzhugh Lee III, USN - Pilot on the pre-war carrier USS *ENTERPRISE*, commanded Escort Carrier CVE 61 (USS *MANILIA BAY*) at the Battle of Leyte Gulf, present at surrender ceremonies on the USS *MISSOURI*, aide to Secretary of the navy John L. Sullivan during the Truman Administration, retired in 1962 with the rank of Vice Admiral.

Confederate Major General Simon Bolivar Buckner, surrendered Fort Donelson to Grant, father of...Army Lt. General Simon Bolivar Buckner, Jr. - WWII killed by a sniper at Okinawa. **Editor's Note Buckner was the highest ranking General killed by enemy fire in WWII. He was posthumously promoted to 4 Star General.**

Confederate Private William A. McCain, 5th Mississippi Cavalry, grandfather of...Admiral John S. "Slew" McCain, Sr. - commander of Task Force 58 in Halsey's Third Fleet, and who was present at surrender ceremonies on the USS *Missouri*. He died only four days afterward. (He was also the grandfather of Republican Presidential candidate Senator John S. McCain III.) **Editor's Note: If you remember, Senator McCain never said a word about his Confederate ancestor during the campaign, or before or since, as far as I know.**

Confederate Major Manning H. Kimmel, Lt. In the 2nd US Cavalry in the pre-Civil War army and had been involved in an excursion into Mexico by Texas rangers and U.S. Regulars after a raid led by Mexican Bandito Juan Nepomuceno "Cheno" Cortina on Brownsville, Texas (Lee, Stoneman, and Heinzelman were also present), AAG to Brig Gen. Frank Anderson CSA, father of...Admiral Husband E. Kimmel, of Pearl Harbor fame.

He is also the Grandfather of Lt. Commander Manning M. Kimmel, commanding officer of the submarine USS *ROBALO* (SS-273.) Who survived the sinking of his submarine after hitting a mine off of Borneo but was one of the prisoners burnt alive in the "Massacre of Palawan" in December of 1944.

And he is the Grandfather of Captain Thomas K. Kimmel (brother of Manning M.), commanding officer of the submarine USS *BERGALL*. Pulled from combat duty by Admiral Christie after Lt. Commander Kimmel was reported MIA. He commanded the Fleet Submarine Training School at Portsmouth, NH until the conclusion of hostilities whereupon he returned to the command of the *BERGALL*. After holding various other commands he finally retired (circa 1960's) from a career in the Navy and began to focus his efforts to clear his father's name. He was finally successful but

had passed away by the time Admiral Kimmel (and General Short) were finally exonerated in August of 95

Major General George E. Pickett - one of three Generals who led the charge against the Union center at Gettysburg, an event that has come down through history as "Pickett's Charge," and who, forever afterward blamed Lee for the decimation of his Division is the great - grandfather of...Colonel George E. Pickett IV - graduated from West Point in 1942, serving in World War II and the Korean War.

Helen Dortch Longstreet, General Longstreet's second wife (1863 - 1962) contributed to the war effort. In 1943 at the age of 80 she worked at Bell Aircraft as a riveter!!

JUDGE NAPOLITANO ON LINCOLN

The recent discussions in the about Ron Paul's comment regarding Lincoln and his political legacy got me to thinking, wouldn't it be great if Judge Andrew Napolitano, the Fox News Senior Judicial Analyst, would weigh in on the subject. I had this thought because judge Napolitano included a chapter entitled "Dishonest Abe" in his brilliant book, *The Constitution in Exile*. Judge Napolitano is a very busy man, hosting a radio show as well as appearing on television, making speeches all around the country, writing books, and practicing law ---- in addition to (hopefully) having a private family life. Since I am a big fan of his writing, I thought I would try to pique our readers' interest in what the judge has to say on this subject.

The first two sentences of the "Dishonest Abe" chapter of *The Constitution in Exile* are hard hitting: "The Abraham Lincoln of legend is an honest man who freed the slaves and saved the Union. Few things could be more misleading." He then goes on to say exactly what Ron Paul told the *Washington Post*, and which seemed to mystify and confuse Tim Russert in his "Meet the Press" interview with Congressman Paul: "In order to increase his federalist vision of centralized power, 'Honest' Abe misled the nation into an unnecessary war. He claimed that the war was about emancipating slaves, but he could have simply

paid slave owners to free their slaves. . . .The bloodiest war in American history could have been avoided.” And, as Ron Paul would likely add, all the other countries of the world that ended slavery in the nineteenth century, including Britain, Spain, France, Denmark, the Dutch, did so without a war. This, by the way, included the Northern states in the U.S. There were no “civil wars” to free the slaves in Massachusetts, New York (where slavery existed for over 200 years), or Illinois.

Lincoln’s “actions were unconstitutional and he knew it,” writes Napolitano, for “the rights of the states to secede from the Union. . . [are] clearly implicit in the Constitution, since it was the *states* that ratified the Constitution. . . “ Lincoln’s view “was a far departure from the approach of Thomas Jefferson, who recognized states’ rights above those of the Union.” Judge Napolitano also reminds his readers that the issue of using force to keep a state in the union was in fact debated — *and rejected* ---- at the Constitutional Convention as part of the “Virginia Plan.”.

He also discusses Lincoln’s Confiscation Act of 1862, under which “any slaves behind the Union lines were captives of war who were to be freed **and transported to countries in the tropics**. This was in keeping with Dishonest Abe’s lifelong position (his “White Dream,” according to *Ebony* magazine managing editor Lerone Bennett, Jr., author of *Forced into Glory: Abraham Lincoln’s White Dream*) of deporting all blacks from the U.S. “Colonization” was the euphemism that was used for this.

“The Confiscation Acts,” writes Judge Napolitano, “show that Lincoln did not have much concern for the slaves. He did not suggest to Congress that freed slaves should be granted civil rights or citizenship in northern states. Once the freed slaves were transported out of the United States, they would no longer be Lincoln’s problem.” This is also why Lincoln tinkered with proposals for compensated emancipation in the border states while they were under U.S. military occupation during the war. These proposals included *immediate deportation* of any freed slaves. He saw the occupation of the border states during the war as an opportunity to begin ridding the country of “The Africans,” as he referred to black people, as though they were from another planet. Judge Napolitano quotes Lincoln in one of his debates with Stephen Douglas as saying what he repeatedly said throughout his adult life: “I will say then that I am not, nor ever have been in favor of bringing about in any way the social and political equality of the white and black races — that I am not nor ever have been in

favor making voters or jurors of negroes.” “Lincoln was more concerned about the failure of [the seceding] states to collect tariffs than he was about slavery,” says Napolitano.

Unlike all those hopelessly miseducated neocon pundits who sneered at Ron Paul’s statements regarding how Lincoln did tremendous damage to the principles of the American founders, Judge Napolitano is well schooled in constitutional history. He declaring martial law, suspending habeas corpus, seizing . . . private property without compensation (including railroads and telegraphs), conducting a war without the consent of Congress, imprisoning nearly thirty thousand *Northern* citizens without trial, shutting down . . . newspapers, and even deporting a congressman (Clement L. Vallandigham from Ohio) because he objected to the imposition of an income tax.” .

“Saying that Lincoln abolished slavery and calling him the ‘Great Emancipator’ are grossly inadequate mischaracterizations,” writes the judge. “Lincoln was interested in promoting his political agenda of centralizing government power, and freeing the slaves was only a means of advancement of that end.”

Lincoln **destroyed** the union of the founding fathers. He “replaced a voluntary association of states with a strong centralized government. The president and his party eagerly lifted the floodgates to *the modern thuggish style of ruling that the U.S. government now employs*” (emphasis added). This “opened the door to more unconstitutional acts by the government in the 1900s through to today.”

The next time you see Lincoln’s portrait on a five-dollar bill, the judge concludes, “remember how many civil liberties he took away from you.”
